DPP Guidance

- How YDA will meet the child's needs
- Recording of roles and responsibilities of partner organisations (the LA and YOT specifically)
- The circumstances that contributed to alleged involvement in any offending
- Support that should be offered when they return to the community to prevent (re)offending
- DPP is required for children who are already looked after but who are remanded to YDA; this will be based upon the assessment informing the child's current care or pathway plan.
- The Local Authority are **not** required to produce a 'plan for permanence', however in assessing the child's needs will need to consider whether the child might need to remain looked after once the remand has ceased.
- If it is considered that the child should indeed remain looked after, circumstances dictate that the local authority must comply with the requirements of the Care Planning Regulations and develop a plan for permanence as part of the process of developing the care plan for the child concerned.
